

FVSN Meeting Minutes August 2025

Parole Board/DPSST Updates:

*Kara Brooks from Parole Board did not have any new updates at this time.

*Jason Ridgeway from DPSST did not have any new updates at this time.

DOC Updates:

*Jon Hansen shared that the BIP advisory committee is working to rewrite rule and language around Division 87 which directly impacts providers and Community Corrections.

*Jon sent census a few months ago asking for feedback regarding the processes in Oregon for referring someone to treatment. Jon has been gathering data to answer some important questions as related to Division 87. Why do we use the ODARA? What does EBP really mean? Does risk level matter? And if provider is administering same treatment program, does risk level matter? Follow up to come.

OACCD Updates:

*Robert Rodriguez from Jefferson County is the new OACCD Liaison for FVSN. He will be taking over for Scott Hyde in this position.

*OACCD has approved training request in the amount of \$3300 and the budget submitted was also approved.

- Scott shared that it was discussed with OACCD and all directors regarding charging participants for the DV Academy this year. It was proposed that each attendee be charged \$100 registration fee. Scott said all county directors agreed that it would be doable for their county. We will be moving forward with the fee at this year's upcoming DV Academy to offset costs.

- Potential scholarship/subsidy program for those who want to come but are traveling from very far away or that the fee would be an extreme hardship for that individual county. In addition, those that are involved in the preparation of the academy would not be charged registration fee.
- Jason Ridgeway/Chris Enquist from DPSST discussed possibly utilizing DPSST for FVSN or larger trainings in the future as a potential cost-cutting avenue for counties.
- It was recommended that any additional funds collected but not used should remain with FVSN for the purposes of use with this specific network.

*Legislative session has ended and there is a substantial shortfall in the ODOT budget. Despite the federal funds being impacted, directors are working to advocate for any additional dollars that could be allotted to Community Corrections. These changes will most likely be seen in 2026-27 and will take effect in the 2027-28 biennium.

* Due to the shortfall in funding, the ability for Community Corrections to meet all requirements has become challenging. Individual counties are making adjustments to balance the gap between expectations and realistic abilities.

Training:

*Michael Harling-A&D Counselor for the Tolowa Dee-Ni' Nation-CADCII

- Certified in both Oregon and California with over 6000 hours of training
- 18 years in this field teaching CBT
- Also teaches DBT and other cognitive based curriculum
- Program is a minimum of 4 months with 2 in person groups and 2 virtual groups a week. Individual meetings with Michael each week as well. Also, Michael will see individuals who are incarcerated
- ACES scores are directly correlated to addiction
- Addiction is a mind disease and often shifts from choice to over the line. Has had a lot of success with this program serving those on the coast.

***Donnie Dotson- Cellebrite**

- Provides digital investigation platforms and forensic technology to law enforcement and other organizations for lawfully extracting, analyzing, and managing digital evidence from devices.
- Helps access data from iOS and Android devices, including call logs, texts, and location data.
- Offers tools for secure evidence management, sharing, and collaboration, supporting criminal investigations. Can be accessed 2 ways either through a search warrant or consent (see attached form)
- Extracting reports can be done in various ways-UFBR is the best way and compiles data in concise format. PDF is another option but can be very lengthy, into hundreds of pages.

***Forest Ledbetter- DOC Correctional Communication Systems**

- Victim contact while in prison-imperfect system that does not have the same oversight as it used to. Previously inmate counselors had a more proactive approach to monitoring and prohibiting victim contact, but that has systematically shifted.
- Community Corrections Agencies can request to have access to the phone calls through an Interagency Agreement with DOC
- Agency leadership would contact administrator Kira Hardy for forms requesting the agreement if one is not already on file. (971-707-1282, kira.j.hardy@doc.oregon.gov)
- Each account is verified by ID prior to calls going through, but often the victim is initiating contact and using various accounts of family and friends.
- Future goals of a more unified approach to addressing the prohibited contact will be discussed. It was mentioned that emailing judgment orders that prohibit contact with listed individuals could be sent to the prison staff who oversee that.

BIP Updates:

*Working to compile updated list of BIP providers throughout the state. Which providers accept OHP? Which are available online? Members were reminded to email Michele Barnes with their list so master list could be generated.

*DV IRT-members gave feedback about adding/deleting certain criteria on the IRT form to contain additional pertinent information and remove unnecessary items. The new form will be submitted to Robert Rodriguez for presentation to OACCD for approval.

Other Updates:

*Nominations for next round of board positions took place. The positions are for 2 years. Voting will take place at FVSN quarterly meeting on Thursday October 8th at the end of DV academy.

- Nominees- Beth Zubar for chair, Michele Barnes for co-chair, and Mayra Mendoza for Secretary.

*All DV academy presenter spots have been filled. Still need some additional Bio's from the presenters for pamphlets. Discussed doing online review program or survey monkey for feedback about presenters and topics. Gretchen will work on doing a Kahoot for opening of academy.

*Jon Hansen mentioned a 4-hour policy writing workshop that he will be hosting that allow counties to provide input. This has not been scheduled yet.

*Brainline is a TBI Assessment tool that is free. The virtual training takes approximately 45 minutes online to complete.

*Oregon Peace Officers Association Conference is the first week in November at Spirit Mountain Casino. Awards can be given to individuals via online process where recommendations can be submitted. Great opportunity to recognize P&P in law enforcement.

*Jason Ridgeway would like to support FVSN being provided to individuals at the academy. Most of the curriculum is being revamped and he would like FVSN to be a part of it, specifically the 4-hour presentation on DV Awareness. Jason will be added to the agenda for February's meeting in Clatsop County.
