#### **Gender Conference**

- Have met a couple times and want to share the ideas that came up after the last conference:
  - Discussed scenarios and how people often don't show up, possibly do frag drills throughout. Also discussed making the conference shorter. Got a lot of feedback on what people wanted more of. Working with women who are on for domestic violence, more hands-on safety planning.
  - Safety compass was well received, talked about having her come back out and spend more time with her.
  - Suggestion to focus on human trafficking. Case planning for women on DV caseload? Could include in topic about female DV.
  - Stalking? WRNA and Normative feedback? Panel? Resiliency, working with DHS. Trauma informed case management.
  - Challenging to nail down specific focus. Focus should include a women's pathway into the CJ system. Lundy Bancroft has done a lot of research and has written a handful of books on this topic.
  - Interest in community safety aspect of women with weapons.
  - Next conference is planned for 2027, possibly in Lane County, but a specific date hasn't been set. Do we want to have an online option, suggestion to do it all in person. Possibly April or May. Want to be mindful of FVSN and if we're covering topics about DV we don't want to miss the opportunity for added engagement.
    - Settling on April 2027, two days, Tuesday/Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> is tentative date. Looking at location options. For now, Lane County is willing to host and booked the conference room, but the plan will be to try and book DPSST six months prior to the conference.
  - Lots of discussion around scenarios and the desire to try frag drills.
  - Need to schedule workgroup, could use some added participation: Shawnee, Lexi, Kelly Kuenzi are willing to help.

### **GIPA Implementation Paula**

- GIPA (Gender Informed Practices Assessment) completed at DOC by a lot of people provided recommendations for DOC.
  - Report came out in 2023, very detailed. Governor was involved, things were implemented, does involve community corrections somewhat, but mostly Coffee Creek.
  - Coming up with better ways to serve this population, what can they do in coffee creek to help prepare for release. Focus groups are happening. Creating a more detailed, client-focused release plan. Can be uploaded to OMS and accessed by PO. Trying to create more access to release counselors. Requirement to meet with RC in six month window, but looking to provide more opportunities to meet.
  - Reach-ins: women would feel more comfortable if they had a reach-in.
    - We're in agreement about how it is best practice to do reach-ins.
  - Josephine County utilizes Welcome Home Oregon and they set up reach-ins. All clients get
  - CREW Connecting Resources to Empowering Women through Transformative Justice Community. Planning to have someone come speak at next meeting to share more about this resource.
  - Discussion about developing a Safety Plan to community corrections from AIC to have contact with someone who they may not be allowed to have contact with prior to release.
    - This issue comes up a lot throughout the state. Creates resentment between client and PO upon release.
  - Sarah Lazzari is the Correctional Rehabilitation Manager at Coffee Creek.
  - Another topic that came up is sustainable housing for women, will continue to be brought up state-wide.
  - Another thing is DV Trauma survivor waiver: looking at survivors who request a waiver due to safety

### **WRNA Booster**

- Reviewed slides. Version 7 will be out soon. Would like to offer virtual options. WRNA booster is recommended every 3 years and an initial every 5 years.
- Booster is almost ready to go, needs a few more updates. Booster will have highlight of what's different/new. Plan to do a side-by-side comparison of the assessment vs handbook. Quick refresher on normative feedback. 3-4 hours.
- Dr Salisbury wants to roll out version 8 soon. In the process of working through the MRNA, she identified things she wants to include in the WRNA.
- Last projection for WRNA 7 rollout was Spring. Option to take booster before it rolls out or after.
- April 28<sup>th</sup> at DPSST for booster training (Tentative pending DPSST)

### **WRNA training schedule**

- Next WRNA training March 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> in Lane County, currently have 16 people scheduled.
- 10-3pm April 21<sup>st</sup> in Washington County, allowing ~60 participants

### **Screening Tool/Intake Form Workgroup**

- Reviewed questions on the screening tool. Feedback from Ester from Safety Compass, liked the questions, but she thinks there could be better options out there. Plan to bring back the workgroup.

### **Roundtable**

- June meeting currently second week of June 9-11, will reach out to people to see if this date impacts them.
- Next agenda item to review moderate risk score workgroup.

### **Follow-up:**

- Schedule a Gender Responsive Conference workgroup for 2027. Shawnee Sandri, Lexi Meyer and Kelly Kuenzi are open to helping with that.
